

HISTORY

Birch State Park is a tropical oasis that was once home to Hugh Taylor Birch, a prominent Chicago attorney, real estate investor, and naturalist, who deeded 180-acres of his hidden paradise to the

State of Florida in 1941. Opened to the public as a state park in the early '50s, his priceless gift remains an enduring legacy of green for residents and tourists to enjoy. Birch also gave his daughter, Helen, 35 acres to the south of the park as a wedding present and oversaw the

Terramar House construction of what is now Bonnet House Museum and Gardens (later given to Florida Trust for Historic Preservation).

FATHER OF FORT LAUDERDALE BEACH

Last but not least, Birch gave the City of Fort Lauderdale its economic engine when he donated almost three-miles of beach with the stipulation that it remain visible and accessible to the public forever. This gift is why Birch was recently inducted into the Fort Lauderdale Hall of Fame and dubbed, "The Father of Fort Lauderdale Beach".

BRING BIRCH BACK

"Bring Birch Back" is Friends' rallying cry. Our goal is to make Hugh Taylor Birch State Park, once again, the best state park in Florida. Toward that end, we have new, enthusiastic park management; new committed Friends' staff, board of directors and honorary council; active support groups (the Seagulls and the RNGRs – a young professionals group); and a new concessionaire (BG Capital) who plans to bring back the café' and upgrade concessions.

WE'RE ON OUR WAY

We have launched a \$12 million capital campaign raising \$8 million from public funds and \$4 million from private funds. To date, we have secured \$5 million in public grants and have applied for approximately \$3 million more. Planned updates and additions include: ADA accesible playgrounds, additional Intracoastal Waterway pavilions and picnic areas, the Terramar Visitor and Education Center, an Arts and Education Stage, a Meditation Garden, a floating Public Boat Dock, a Mangrove Walkway... and more!
