Long Lake Clean Out Update



Thanks to the Community Foundation of Broward and Bank of America, Friends received a generous grant to launch Phase 3 of the clean-out of our 1-mile-long fresh water coastal dune lake. Phase 3 addressed the northern-most end of the lake which was clogged by invasive cattails and hydrilla.

Mechanical clean out kicked off April 1 when crews from Organic Sediment Removal arrived. A crane was brought in from the Elks' Youth Camp to launch a pontoon boat and 5,000 lb. barge to support the pump. Crews were able to pump nearly 1,900 feet of the lake and clear a 10ft wide channel in that section. They were deliberate in their location, removing sediment from sections to prevent further growth of cattails and hydrilla. The result was creating full access to the 1.2-mile lake for recreational use.

Two large muck bags (90"x100" and 45"x100") were set up at the north end of the park. Each muck bag was filled to the top, three times before being sealed. Experts project a total of 3,000 cubic yards of sediment were removed. The muck bags will stay in place as the soil dries. The sediment will then be tested. Based on the results it will either remain in the park or be removed to an appropriate facility.
