### Birch Bus Buddies Returns — **Connecting Kids with Nature!**







This fall, we proudly relaunched our Birch Bus Buddies program, thanks to the generous support of the Amaturo Family Foundation, Amazon, and JM Family Enterprises. After a brief pause, the buses rolled back into the park—bringing the joyful energy of nearly 300 elementary students from five Broward County schools, grades 1-4.

The program covers transportation costs and offers guided, nature-based experiences for young learners—many visiting a state park for the very first time. With the help of dedicated volunteers, park rangers, and staff, students explored the trails on nature hikes, learned to sign native animal names in American Sign Language, created crafts, and played Junior Ranger favorites like Possum Tag!

Kids also had the chance to get up close with some of the park's **native** animal ambassadors, sparking curiosity and a deeper appreciation for Florida's wildlife. Huge thanks to Rangers Heather and Marc for leading these enriching, hands-on experiences. # **BIRCH IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY**

#### CULVERT REPLACEMENT



Long-awaited infrastructure improvements are now underway along the loop road near the Boat Dock Welcome Pavilion. At the end of May, crews began staging equipment and preparing the site, and throughout early June, periodic closures on the Main Loop Road have taken place to allow safe access for the work.

In partnership with the Florida Inland

Navigational District, the Department of Environmental Protection is replacing an aging culvert beneath the roadway. While this may cause temporary inconvenience for visitors, the upgrade is a crucial step toward protecting the



park's natural systems and improving safety.

Culverts may be out of sight, but they play a vital rolepreventing flooding and erosion, supporting native plants and wildlife, and ensuring safe, accessible trails and roads throughout the park.



#### TRESTLE TRAIL OVER LONG LAKE

While we had high hopes following a promising update last fall from the Recreational Trails Program (RTP)—which indicated there was enough funding to support all 12 eligible projects—we received unexpected news late last year. Due to a post-meeting audit by the Florida Highway Administration, it was determined that only \$1.1 million was available for funding, far less than the initially projected \$3.5 million. As a result, only the top four projects were awarded grants, and our project, ranked fifth, just missed the cutoff.

While this development was certainly a disappointment, our passion for the Trestle Trail Project remains strong. We've already taken action—resubmitting our application for the 2025–2026 RTP funding cycle, and we're currently awaiting an invitation to present to the board later this summer.

We're also grateful to have secured a generous \$100,000 contribution from Dr. Douglas Thieme and his family, bringing us one step closer to making this transformational project a reality. With continued community support and the RTP matching grant, we remain optimistic that construction will begin in early 2026.

Stay tuned—and thank you for believing in Birch's bright future!

#### Long Lake Long Lake Restoration Efforts Continue

Long Lake restoration remains a top priority for both the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and Friends of Birch State Park. Over the past several weeks, our trusted

partners at Southeast Land and Water Management have been hard at work to enhance this treasured natural feature.

These crews, who routinely treat the lake with organic solutions to control invasive plant species, have gone a step further — clearing key channels to improve boat and kayak access, removing built-up sediment from congested areas and the historic moat, and pulling debris, palm fronds, and fallen branches from the water



These efforts not only make the lake more navigable for canoe and kavak enthusiasts, but also allow for more effective longterm treatment and preservation of this rare coastal dune lake. Thanks to this important work, Long Lake is on its way to becoming more beautiful, accessible, and ecologically healthy than ever.

#### Elks Youth Camp Reopens for Summer Fun

The Elks Youth Camp at Birch is back and better than ever! After an unexpected roof leak led to a temporary closure in late 2024, the Elks Lodge and cabins have been refreshed and are now ready to welcome campers for an unforgettable, nature-filled summer.



Thanks to support from the Division, a full re-roof of the lodge was completed. With generous funding from The Atkinson Family Foundation, the Friends were able to tackle mold remediation, repair ceilings, install new blinds, and even purchase a brand-new set of banquet

chairs. The result? A fresh, clean, and welcoming space for campers to enjoy.

Our incredible park volunteers and Rangers also deserve a round of applause. They've spent months painting, cleaning, and trimming the grounds — all to ensure campers can enjoy a one-of-a-kind overnight experience under the stars.

A special thank-you goes to Marcus Unterweger of MUEngineers, who continues to monitor the structural integrity of the lodge and other aging buildings in the park. His expert oversight is invaluable to our efforts to preserve these cherished spaces.

#### Floating Boat Dock Repairs Underway

Good news is on the (rising) tide — repairs to our beloved Floating Boat Dock are finally in motion! After months of delays due to back-ordered parts, crews from B&M Marine recently arrived by barge to begin the long-awaited work.



Unfortunately, between their initial assessment and arrival, the dock sustained additional damage. This meant not only a change of plans, but also the need for more parts — and, of course, more funding. Thankfully, the necessary funds have been secured, and the new parts are now officially on order.

We know how much our boating community values access to the park, and we're doing everything we can to ensure a safe, functional,

and welcoming dock is ready to go by this summer.

Thank you for your patience and continued support as we navigate the challenges of maintaining infrastructure in a dynamic, coastal environment. We can't wait to welcome boaters back to Birch in style — and securely tied up.

#### Terramar Gets a Much-Needed Electrical Upgrade

Thanks to the incredible generosity of Ken Kettner of Electrical Consulting Services, Inc., the Terramar Visitor Center is now equipped with a brand-new breaker panel and updated electrical wiring. This essential upgrade replaced aging

equipment that had deteriorated over time due to the park's salty coastal environment.

This improvement marks another important step in preserving the 85-year-old Terramar Visitor Center, ensuring it remains safe, functional, and welcoming for generations to come. We are deeply grateful for Ken's expertise and commitment to Birch.

With this grant, we'll construct new outdoor enclosures for Olive Oil and Cinnamon, provide Taurus with an upgraded indoor habitat inside the Terramar Visitor Center, and install interpretive signage to further our educational mission. The funds will also cover ongoing needs like veterinary care, feeding, and habitat maintenance—ensuring our animal ambassadors are healthy, comfortable, and ready to inspire.



We're incredibly grateful to the Community Foundation of Broward for their support—and to all of you who show up, sleeves rolled up, ready to make a difference.


# CELEBRATING FRIENDS SUCCESS

Their presentation highlighted how our organization has grown into a self-sufficient nonprofit with two full-time staff members and a dynamic board of 30 dedicated professionals. Most impressively, Friends of Birch has contributed over \$10 million in direct support to Hugh Taylor Birch State Park over the past decade — a testament to the power of community, partnership, and purpose-driven stewardship.

It was a proud moment to share our journey and success story with peers from across the state, reinforcing our role as a model for impactful park support.
